- There were numerous other tasks performed by the road department during the above referenced time period including but not limited to:
 - Unstopping drainage pipes,
 - Cleaning out beaver dams around the county
 - Clearing ditches
 - Removing fallen trees from right of way
 - Assisting head start with debris removal and assisted with placing mulch at playground
 - Installed speed breakers on College Avenue
 - Trimmed limbs in different areas around the county with pole saw
 - Installation of street signs as they are reported or observed missing.
Reminder signs must be ordered and take several weeks to be delivered
- 12M-2 Caterpillar Motor Grader Lease option is up and has been returned to dealership and a 12M-3 Motor Grader will be delivered in August of 2019. The delay is due to caterpillar shipping the 12M-3 directly from the factory once it has been assembled.
 - (2014) The payment on the 12 M-2 was \$1,069.00 per month including two trade ins. (Lee Boy Paver & old 770 John Deere Grader)
 - The payment on the 12M-3 will be \$1,772.00 after negotiating increased equity in the old lease due to less mileage.
 - Payment on the new grader will begin once it is delivered.
 - Dah150-E Grinder head has been returned and the payment for that attachment can be applied to other equipment. (\$955.00)
- Hancock County Summer Camp Budget is \$10,000.00 total for all camps. There may be supplemental funds from other organizations to assist camps. I will keep you posted once all information is confirmed.
- May 2, 2019 Hancock County went live on the General Ledger Funds with the Tyler Technologies Accounting Software. A great deal of work has been done by commission office staff to move forward with the software and we are learning more by the day.
 - Utility Billing will go live in June 2019 and commission office staff is working hard to make this process a success also. I will keep you posted as we continue to make progress with the Tyler Accounting Software.
- Hancock County Health Department Renovation (CDBG) Project is progressing along on schedule and the contractor is Viking Construction Management Inc. of Sandersville GA. The original contract sum is \$629,447.00 and totaled payed/ billed as of (5-6-2019) is \$203,343.60.

- Bridge Repairs are scheduled for Fulsome Creek Road, Water Works Road, Davis Road, and Glenn Ford Road through assistance of Georgia Department of Transportation. Bridges are listed to be repaired and I apologize for the delay, but the delays are beyond our control with state funded projects. I will keep you posted as I receive more information.
- Culvert Installment on Island Creek Drive West will take place over the next couple of months and will consist of (2) sixty-five feet long culverts which are 84 inches in diameter. There will be a temporary road installed while the repair work is going on. I will keep you posted as this project gets underway.
- Hancock County 2019 LMIG Patching, Paving, and Resurfacing Project has been posted to bid both in the local newspaper organ and the Georgia Procurement Registry. The Project Consists of the following:
 - RESURFACING & STRIPING
 - Ash Lane: from Sandy Run Dr to cul-de-sac, distance of approximately .07 miles
 - Woodland Way: from Lake Crest Dr to cul-de-sac, distance of approximately 0.10 miles
 - PATCHING, LEVLEING & STRIPING
 - Friendship Nebo Road: from Baldwin County Line to Linton Rd, distance of approximately 5.40 miles
 - Warren Chapel Road: from Pumping Station Road to Cul-de-sac at James Way, distance of approximately 3.54 miles
 - Linton Road: from pavement joint (0.10 mile east of Beulah Hwy) to Washington County Line, distance of approximately 4.5 miles
 - Hunts Chapel Road: from Pumping Station Road to Stembridge Road, distance of approximately 3.91 miles
 - PATCHING, RESURFACING & STRIPING
 - Dogwood Drive: from Lake Crest Dr to cul-de-sac, distance of approximately 0.26 miles
 - Forest Court: from Lake Crest Dr to cul-de-sac, distance of approximately .03 miles
 - Sycamore Lane: from Sandy Run Dr to cul-de-sac, distance of approximately .07 miles
 - Birch Lane: from Sandy Run Dr to cul-de-sac, distance of approximately .07 miles
 - Gum Cemetery Rd: from Jay's Cut Thru Rd to Baldwin County Line pavement joint, distance of approximately 0.6 miles
 - School House Acres Rd: from SR 15 to cul-de-sac, distance of approximately 0.55 miles

- PATCHING & STRIPING
 - Centennial Road: from SR16 to Greene County line, distance of approximately 4.92 miles
- STRIPING
 - Jamesway Drive: from Warren Chapel Rd to end of pavement, distance of approximately 1.65 miles
- Hancock County Road Department has hot asphalt patching scheduled to begin over the next 4 – 6 weeks. We will be addressing a number of side roads in the east lake area and through out the county.
 - During this process, hot asphalt is hauled in, dumped, spread with a motor grader or back hoe, and when possible, a roller is used to assist.
 - This process is effective and addresses temporary patching that cold patch does not and helps build a base for future resurfacing.
